

PUBLIC WORKS REPORT

August 14, 2008

STREETS:

Sultan Basin Road Phase III has received verbal approval of Federal Functional Classification as Minor Collector from the Olympia Federal Department of Transportation. Carole Feldmann was the city staff person who filled out the Functional Classification application and followed the process for the City to receive the classification on this new portion of Sultan Basin Rd. The Interlocal Agency Agreement (ILA) was approved by Council December 13, 2007 was submitted to PSRC for obligation of funds, then suspended until Sultan received the Federal Functional Classification. The amount the City is obligating is \$194,000 of the \$1,009,164 for preconstruction (design).

The Public Works Department called for Statements of Qualifications (SOQ) from the Municipal Research Service Center (MRSC) Engineer Roster from three firms:

WH Pacific,
PACE, and
Perteet

Receiving only a SOQ from WH Pacific, Bothell, WA at the August 24, 2008 Council meeting staff will be presenting a contract for WH Pacific to design Phase III of the Sultan Basin Road will be on the agenda.

BUILDING:

INVITATION TO BID:

The cricket between the old food bank building and the newer metal building to prevent rain damage strongly suggested by staff of Snohomish County Planning and Development Housing Community Development Block Grant was sent to five contractors:

Mike's Roofing, Inc.


The cricket is a small 4/12 roof connecting two structures to divert rain and moisture away from the area between the two structures. The older building has leaking rain gutters, and a back porch halfway into the metal food bank building. The newer metal building has a partial open space facing the older building so when it rains the Food Bank has water coming into their building where food is stored.

The City will receive the bids to determine the exact cost then find funding for this building maintenance project. The Building Official estimate was \$5,000.00.

PARKS:

IT LOOK LIKE WE ARE GOING TO HAVE A SKATE PARK. Sky High Skate Park is closer to reality. Carole Feldmann took the "park by the ramps" contacted Spohn Ranch, Northwest Recreation of Washington, from the State bid list for Skate Park

components and with the purchase order signed Sultan ordered Phase I components. Installation is scheduled for the week of October 6, 2008, historically the first two weeks of October are great weather, and construction of this type is weather sensitive. The plan is by October 10th park components will be fully installed. Sky High SK8 Park is closer to a reality. Congratulations to all that have worked towards this park improvement.
