


Notable Events During December 2009

- This month the Castillo brothers were set for trial for the Antonio Marks murder case from last summer. The brothers pled guilty and have been sentenced to prison, along with a third suspect. There are two more suspects yet to be tried so we are nearing the end of this dark place in our history.
- Scott Berg was called to a house near 8th street for a report of possible stolen property. The father / homeowner at the house told Scott that he had made his adult daughter leave the house because she was not obeying the house rules. When he was cleaning her room, he found several items in her closet and believed they were stolen. Berg recovered the items and has traced a couple of the items back to vehicle prowls in town. The investigation continues.
- Our reports of thefts and vehicle prowls have gone down to 19 this month, from the 27 we had reported in November. We are following up on leads and the guys have been trying to develop information from local residents to identify the suspects.
- We introduced the "Drug Take Back Program", in concert with the Snohomish Regional Narcotics Task Force. Everyone hears about the manufacturing and sale of marijuana and methamphetamines but most don't realize that theft and abuse of prescription drugs has grown to epidemic proportion in our country. The Drug Take Back Program allows citizens to bring their unused or unneeded prescription drugs to the police station and seal them in an envelope and ultimately into a safe, where they will later be picked up by members of the Task Force and properly disposed of.
- Please take a couple minutes to review the attached graphs of our calls for service for the month of December and all of 2009. They are compared to the same time periods in 2008 and over all I'm pretty happy with them. You will notice our average number of burglaries, malicious mischief, vehicle thefts and vehicle recoveries all went down in 2009 while thefts went up. The average number of calls for service by the public went down as did the number of self generated calls for service, while the average number of calls per deputy went up, because we have fewer deputies assigned in Sultan than the number of Sultan officers, when Sultan had its own police department.



Property Crimes Within Sultan City Limits




