

## *Notable Events of October 2010*

- Although this month we handled 200 less calls for service than we did in October 2009, had no reported burglaries, fewer thefts and auto thefts, it was a busy month.
- School Resource Officer (SRO) Tom Dittoe helped arrange this year's homecoming parade and invited two Sheriff's Office motorcycles and a traffic unit to help escort the parade and control traffic. Tom is also a member of the county wide SRO association which meets every month. This month Dittoe sponsored the meeting here in Sultan and was joined by several agencies from around Snohomish County.
- We completed our yearly evacuation drill earlier this month and were pleased to see it only took our students and staff 12 minutes to leave their schools and reach the top of the Loves Hill Evacuation route. During the debriefing which followed the drill, there was discussion about organizing a city wide VHF system for all of our school and city staff and volunteers to use during an emergency.
- At our Sultan school, fire, city and police meeting we collected 20 – 30 old VFH radios that were formerly used by all these agencies and decided on 10 frequencies we wanted to install in them. When this radio system is complete, we plan to store the radios at the Emergency Operations Center on the four lanes that will be available to volunteers and city staff during emergencies.
- Fire and police responded to a report of a fire under one of the 311<sup>th</sup> bridges and quickly learned something under the wooden bridge had caught fire, spreading to the wooden stringers under the bridge. The fire was quickly put out and we learned some homeless people had been living under the bridge. The Fire Marshal's Office and deputies have been interviewing a number of people about the fire and have a few people of interest. The investigation continues and the bridge is open with a 5 ton limit on it.
- In September Mayor Eslick and Council approved Sultan's new Panhandler's Ordinance, restricting where and when people can panhandle in the city. The police department has not been aggressively enforcing this new law until we were able to organize a public education program. Sandy Collins our secretary and another secretary from the Sheriff's Office have been working on an educational pamphlet and completed it in October. The pamphlet is attached and is being distributed throughout Sultan. As promised we will respond to complaints of panhandling but do not expect to aggressively seek out the violation.
- Several members of our Block Watch attended a meeting earlier this month and learned about the Watch Dog Program and received a presentation from three Snohomish County Sheriff's Office canine deputies, with their dogs.



## Property Crimes - Sultan




