WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT—PROJECT UPDATE

The City of Sultan is doing upgrades to the City's Wastewater Treatment Plant. This will include adding a new oxidation ditch, biosolids handling building and a third secondary clarifier as well as other site improvements. Work will begin sometime the week of July 5, 2022 and should last until December 2024.
